Prof. Liliana S. Voto graduated with honors at the School of Medicine of the University of Buenos Aires in 1973 and obtained her PhD in Medicine at the same university in 1984. She completed her residency in Obstetrics and Gynaecology in 1979 and five year later she joined the faculty of the School of Medicine of Buenos Aires University as Assistant Professor. In 1992 she became specialist in Public Health (Salvador University) and recertified as Specialist in Obstetrics and Gynaecology, degree granted by the Buenos Aires Obstetrics & Gynaecology Society.

Prof. Voto was appointed Associate Professor of Obstetrics at Buenos Aires University in 1991 and promoted to Full Professor in 1997. She was also made Full Professor of Obstetrics at Barceló University in Buenos Aires in 1996 and in July 2009 she became Research Faculty of the Health Sciences University Institute, School of Medicine of Barceló Foundation.

In 2012 she received the recertification of the Argentine Society of Hypertension.

She was Director of the III Global Congress on Maternal and Infant Health of the Course of the IAN DONALD SCHOOL OF ULTRASOUND in Buenos Aires, Argentina, on November 16 – 19, 2013.

She was Director of the OB/GYN Department of the School of Medicine of Buenos Aires University and continuous at present as a member of the Council.

She is also instructor of the Rotation Internship, of the OB/GYN Rotation at the School of Medicine, Health Sciences University Institute Barceló Foundation.

Prof. Voto's main contributions have been in the field of Rh Isoimmunization, Hypertension in Pregnancy, Fetal Therapy, High Risk Pregnancy, Antiphospholipid Syndrome and Early Pregnancy Losses She has been author or coauthor in over 40 books and scientific publications, and over 280 important scientific papers and articles. She has attended training courses in Argentina and abroad. She has lectured extensively at both local and international meetings and has organized innumerable national and international meetings and congresses: ISUOG (1999); WAMP (1999), the XXIst Fetus as a Patient Congress held in Buenos Aires in April 2005, the III Global Congress of Maternal and Infant Health, Ian Donald School of Ultrasound in Buenos Aires, Argentina on November 16 – 19, 2013, the 10th International Meeting of the International Academy of Perinatal Medicine on November 6-7, 2014 at the National Academy of Medicine of Buenos Aires.

In 1989 Prof. Voto was fellow and co-investigator at the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Queen's Medical Centre, University of Nottingham, England. From 1992 to 1993 she was coordinator in Argentina of the collaborative project "Collaborative Low-Dose Aspirin Study in Pregnancy for the Prevention and Treatment of Pre-eclampsia and Intrauterine Growth Retardation" (CLASP), organized in Oxford, England, by a Committee including Drs. C. Redman, M. de Swiet, P. Rubin, E. M. Symonds and M. Elder. From 1993 to 1995 she was Director of the Argentina-England collaborative project "Prevention and promotion of maternal and perinatal health in critically impoverished populations", carried out by Miguel Margulies Foundation for Perinatal Research, the British Council and the British Embassy in Argentina. In 1995 she became a Clinical Investigator for the National Council for Research in Science and Technology (CONICET).

Prof. Voto was the Director of Juan A. Fernández Hospital, Buenos Aires City, Argentina, reference centre for high risk pregnancy and fetal medicine in the country. She was the President of Miguel Margulies Foundation for Perinatal Studies, and is Head of the Institute of Fetal Medicine and High-Risk Pregnancy (named after her) in Buenos Aires city. In addition to these positions, she is an active member of both national and international scientific societies.

In 2008 she became an Associate Member of the International Academy of Perinatal Medicine (President: Prof. Erich Saling) at Cornell University, New York).

She founded the Prof. Dr. Liliana S. Voto Foundation for the Prevention, Promotion and Protection of Maternal and Infant Health in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

Apart from the numerous awards Prof Voto has received for her invaluable scientific work, she has been presented with two special awards for her outstanding performance as Director of Juan A. Fernández Hospital: Award of the Argentine Society of Occupational Medicine to her work as Director of Juan A. Fernández Hospital during the deep socio-economic crisis, November 27, 2002, and "Quality Management in Health", granted by the Secretariat of Health, Government of the City of Buenos Aires, November 19, 2003 and the "Rosa de Plata Award" granted for the Argentine National Parliament for her actived work in maternal and fetal health (2007).
